How do I appeal to regain my financial aid eligibility?

You may appeal to receive financial aid after failure to obtain standards required by SAP by reading/accepting the criteria and completing a Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress Appeal. The appeal form and supporting documentation must be submitted to the Office of Financial Aid by the semester deadline.

SAP Appeals are accepted Fall and Spring semesters only.

What Every Transfer Student Should Know



Welcome Transfer Students!

We are excited that you are interested in transferring to Louisiana Delta Community College (LDCC.) We hope to make the transition easy for you by providing you with important information.

Admissions

Who is considered a Transfer

If you have previously attended any other college or university you are considered a transfer student. Students cannot “start over” in an attempt to remove grades and hours previously attempted. Your academic history stays with you throughout your postsecondary education.

How do I apply?

You can apply online at www.ladelta.edu/admissions/apply.asp. If you need assistance, you may also visit the Admissions Office. Make sure you:

- Indicate on the application your degree program
- Indicate on the application if you have attended any other colleges and/or universities no matter how long you have stayed out of school.
- Request official academic transcripts from all previously attended colleges and/or universities to be mailed to LDCC Admission Office, 7500 Millhaven Road, Monroe, LA 71203

What documents do I need to provide for admission to LDCC?

- Completed, signed application and nonrefundable \$15.00 application fee
- Copy of your current driver’s license or legal ID

- Official high school transcript or GED scores
- Official academic transcripts from each post secondary institution attended
- Official ACT scores (ACT Code 1655), SAT scores (SAT Code 3992) or COMPASS Placement Survey
- Completed Official Immunization Form or proof of two measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR), one current tetanus-diphtheria shot (TD), and a meningitis shot (first time freshmen), or request for exemption
- Proof of registration with Selective Service (<https://www.sss.gov>)

How do I let LDCC know that I am a Transfer Student?

On the Application for Admissions:

- Under Section III Enrollment Classification you will check “Transfer.”
- Under Section V Postsecondary Institutions if you answer yes to either question, and list all postsecondary education institutions on page 3 of the application. You can find more information about LDCC admissions and enrollment process and FAQs at www.ladelta.edu/admissions.

Financial Aid How do I apply for financial federal aid?

You must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit electronically at www.fafsa.gov. LDCC school code is 041301. Each school you listed on the FAFSA will also receive your information electronically. Two weeks after you have submitted your application, contact the Office of Financial Aid to confirm receipt of your application and to find out what



documentation is needed for your file.

What if I have already submitted a FAFSA for the current academic year?

LDCC school code 041301 must be added to your current FAFSA.

****Be sure to submit FAFSA again.****

Transfer students are required to meet the minimum academic standards set by LDCC in order to receive Federal Financial Aid.

- Once all academic grades and credit hours at LDCC have been received and reviewed, the Office of Financial Aid will determine if you are eligible based on Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards.
- Transfer credits that count toward your current program must also count as both attempted and earned hours.
- Your entire academic record is reviewed, including semesters when you did not receive federal financial aid.
- LDCC will verify all of your records with the Department of Education website to determine if you have attended other schools.
- If you are awarded federal aid and LDCC discovers later that that you failed to list all schools attended, the student will be responsible for repayment of the federal aid.

What is Satisfactory Academic Progress?

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) for federal financial aid is defined as:

- Earning (passing) a required number of hours (67% of all hours attempted) and
- Achieving and maintaining a required grade point average.
- Total attempted hours must not exceed 150% of the published length of your degree program.
- Completed Official Immunization Form or proof of two measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR), one current tetanus-diphtheria shot
